The numbers below represent the results we have achieved since the beginning of the 2022/2023 fiscal year which began July 1, 2022.

Delivering The Promise of a Brighter Future

Cory did not know what the future might hold for him when he joined the Marine Forces Reserve, following his high school graduation. Sadly, diagnosis of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) changed his outlook about that future.

After his service term ended, Cory spent his time in shelters while trying to rebuild his life. Fortunately for Cory, he found support and stability at the YMCA's Supportive Housing Campus. Having his own place and feeling safe was a stabilizing force during a hectic and uncertain time for Cory.

Month by month, his future began to look brighter. He once again was in regular contact with his family—especially, his brother and nephews. His employment history stabilized. He managed his own finances and stuck to his budget. He was coached on how to address legal issues that had plagued him. And, best of all, he began to prioritize his mental health needs. As a result of this progress, Cory advanced to the Y's Graduate Program.

Cory is just one of the many success stories reported by The Y's Supportive Housing Campus. This community solution helps eliminate homelessness by providing hope, dignity and support for 140 adults on their way to achieving stable and secure permanent housing.

Today, Cory enjoys living off campus where he continues to work while pursuing a degree in information technology. Thanks to the ongoing support and guidance of his Y Case Manager, Cory is meeting all his goals toward a future that looks promising.
